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Feedback Analysis Report

The results were discussed in IQAC meeting held on 07/01/2022 and were presented in the College Council meeting dated 23/03/2022.

For majority of questions, the index is above 80, ie., the highest level of satisfaction. As the college has limited role in syllabus setting or revision, faculty tries to disseminate curriculum in most effective manner and suggestions are reported informally to Board of Studies.

Consolidated Report of College Council and IQAC

- To improve the perception and learning skills of students, faculty were instructed to incorporate innovative techniques and more ICT methods in the teaching process.
- To cater to learners of all categories and improve students' learning experience, faculty members were encouraged to develop more informative e-contents like Video classes, Blog notes, Podcasts, Slide share etc.
- UG as well as PG students are to be motivated by the faculty members to undertake projects and internships beyond the prescribed curriculum. Also, the recommendation was made to promote more student participation in seminars, conferences, and workshops to improve research aptitude.
- Recommendations were made to improve industrial and research collaborations of all departments to expand experiential learning and the job skills of students.
- Open courses in UG program are changed according to the demand of students.
- 13 additional Smart Classrooms were made available to the students.
- As per the feedback from students, Department of English introduced a new Certificate program entitled "Certificate Course on Translation Studies (SMCS5TS22)" for V Sem B A English batch.
- The elective paper, CSS3E01f-Numerical and Statistical Methods which was delivered in the III Sem of M Sc Computer Applications was changed to CSS3E01c-Web Technology, as per the request of students.



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
