All the administration tasks, scheduling, reporting etc. are managed with the help of Microsoft products especially Microsoft Office product. Neural Networks (Pvt) Ltd is the provider for Microsoft products. The routine works of the library like accessioning, classification, cataloguing, circulation and report generation is being carried through KOHA software. For accounting requirement and to monitor financial activities, the College uses Tally ERP Version 9. In order to maintain students' admission register, a software application, 'ECollege Solutions' from GJ InfoTech (P) Ltd., has been installed in the College campus. Student details like admission, class allotments, fee collection and TC issue are handled through this application The College acknowledges the importance of communication amongst the students, parents, teachers and administration to achieve excellence. With this aim a mobile based application, 'St. Mary's College, Thrissur - SMCT)' with the support of Dakota Technologies has been launched. The application allows the Principal/Administrator to communicate any message to students, teachers or parents, upload event notifications, examination schedule, news etc. The Calendar facility allows the teachers to schedule their activities. The attendance registration in the app allows update student's periodwise attendance. Parents are notified about

the student's examination/results status etc. Faculty can make request for leave through mobile based application `St. Mary's College, Thrissur - SMCT)'. A separate module has been added to `ECollege Solutions' for smooth conduct of university and internal examinations which includes room allotment seating arrangement and reporting of absentees.

CRITERION I – CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

The Principal in consultation with College Council and IQAC plans the academic, co-curricular and extracurricular activities. Academic Calendar and Action Plan are prepared at the onset of the academic year based on the University Academic Calendar. Even though the curriculum is designed by the University, the College takes utmost care in delivering the curriculum in the most effective and systematic manner. Annual academic plan is designed taking into consideration the effective curriculum delivery and transaction. The general time table is prepared by the Time table Committee based on which the departments prepare the Time table for the academic year. The departments prepare their timetable and action plan according to academic calendar of the College. The syllabus is divided among the faculty by the Head of the Department according to their respective areas of specialization. Departments discuss and plan teaching strategies for the effective implementation of curriculum. Individual teachers prepare a monthly teaching plan to organize the teaching process. The Institution has internalized the practices of ensuring curriculum completion within the planned time frame. Extra classes are taken to complete the curriculum within the prescribed time frame. Seminars, Workshops and Extension lectures by subject experts are organized to supplement the curriculum transaction. ICT enabled teaching and innovative teaching methods are effectively used to make the curriculum up-to-date. Students and faculty are motivated to attend MOOCs for updating themselves. Formal feed backs are obtained from all the stakeholders on different aspects of curriculum and its transaction and remedial measures are undertaken wherever necessary to ensure that the stated objectives of the curriculum are achieved. Continuous evaluation and various competitions organized on the subject help in making sure that the curriculum has been transacted effectively The Management takes initiatives for uninterrupted execution of the teaching learning process. The integration of technology into the teaching-learning process is a priority of the institution. Staff vacancies are filled on time for uninterrupted teaching learning process. The institution also organizes seminars and other training programmes to give better exposure to students and teachers. A networking with faculty of colleges in the neighbourhood helps the faculty members to exchange ideas on the curriculum.

Feedback is taken from faculty who have completed teaching at least one semester. Feedback on Institution is taken from Alumnae who have completed their UG or PG programme since 2014. The Department level feedback is consolidated by IQAC and analyzed in Likert Scale format and report is presented in College Council IQAC. Student Feedback Report • Faculty were asked to discuss with the members of Board of studies and make an effort to relate the course content with the current scenario in a possible manner. • It was requested to deliver the course content with practical examples and with reference to real life situations and to encourage the maximum participation of students in the class. Case studies may also be encouraged for practicability. • Faculty need to develop e-resources and guide the students to access, participate and learn through platforms like Swayam, e-PG Pathshala. Effective use of ICT should be done. e- Content development by students is to be encouraged. • Link curriculum with issues of gender, environment, sustainability, ICT, nationalism etc through talks, debates, discussions, exhibitions, seminars and so on. Internal Assessment is conducted as per rules and regulations of University of Calicut. College has initiated a Internal assessment Policy for the conduct of Internal exams. Internal Assessment comprises of Attendance, Seminar, Assignment and test papers. Test papers are conducted in accordance with the academic calendar prepared by the College Council in the beginning of the academic year and on the basis of blueprint of the University year end exam.. Common exam time table is scheduled for internal exam of all UG Programmes. Internal exam for PG Programmes are conducted by respective course faculty. Any change in the conduct of internal exam will be informed to the students at least one week prior to the schedule. Type and date of Seminars and Assignments are the discretion of respective departments. The conduct of internal exam is entrusted to internal exam Core Committee and various sub committees monitor the activities.

2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

The University provides an academic calendar to the institution at the beginning of every academic year. It includes the number of working days,holidays, schedule of semester, examination schedule and so on, which is incorporated into the academic calendar of the College. Re-scheduling of internal assessment exams due to changes in the University end semester exams are discussed and approved in College Council. The regular cleaning and the maintenance of the classrooms, laboratories and other infrastructure will be done as per schedule. Infrastructure is extended to the public for various programmes and extension activities with prior permission. College extends the facilities to SMART- Association of retired faculty and Elder Marian - the Alumnae Association for their meetings and for conducting extension activities. Students and faculty from neighbouring institutions can avail the facilities at the institution with prior sanction. Seminar halls, auditorium and common rooms are utilized for academic and extracurricular activities. The request should be made in the Register maintained in the

Principal's Office. Class rooms are allotted to different batches in accordance to the timetable. Any maintenance required should be informed to the Maintenance Committee through complaint register maintained at the enquiry. Timely maintenance of classrooms is ensured by support staff. HODs should ensure that the classes are maintained well and there is no damage to the functioning of electronic and electrical Equipments in the class. Laboratory rules and regulations are displayed at prominent places. The Computers are maintained and updated regularly by System Administrators. Softwares to prevent malwares are installed and updated. The ICT enabled class rooms are maintained and supervised periodically by Technical experts. Facility to utilize computers for learning and research is ensured in the computer lab subject to rules of the Computer labs and Browsing Centers. Students and Faculty can avail the facilities of health hub according to the time schedule and should strictly follow the rules and regulations. Departments plan teaching strategies for the effective implementation of curriculum. Faculty prepare monthly teaching plan to organize the teaching process. Seminars, Workshops and Extension lectures are organized to supplement the curriculum transaction. Certificate and Value Added Courses help the students acquire additional skills and enhance their employability.
Examination and Evaluation	College conducts Internal Assessment as per rules and regulations of University of Calicut. Two internal examinations, seminars, and assignment provide continuous and consistent measurement of student progress. Duties of conduct of internal exams are entrusted to the Internal Exam Committee. The Consolidated Internal Assessment Sheet is uploaded to the University after displaying it on the student's notice board for 5 working days. Students may report their grievances to College Grievance Redressal Cell if their grievances are not solved satisfactorily at the Departmental level. Summative Assessment is conducted by the University at the end of each semester.
Research and Development	The Research Committee encourages the faculty to pursue research, publish in National and International Journals and take up projects and present papers. College publishes science journal "Annals of Basic and Applied Sciences" each year. The faculty motivates the students to participate and present papers in seminars, publish in journals and take up research project in industries and research laboratories and undertake social projects and pursue internships. MCAR-Research Support Services and Internship Programme provides research assistance and internship facilities for students

	of the College and neighbouring institutions. Faculty and students pursue MOOCs for quality enhancement.
Human Resource Management	Decentralized administration provides for effective human resource management. The Principal in consultation with College Council drafts a work distribution for the academic year by allotting the responsibility of the various Committees, Forums and Cells to respective staff members. The College Council constituted as per University statutes is the most important academic and administrative body of the institution for internal co-ordination. Academic and extension activities of the Departments are coordinated by the Heads of the Department with the cooperation of the faculty and they are directly responsible to the Principal. College Union functions under the guidance of the Student Advisors. IQAC looks into the quality enhancement.

Considering this and keeping in tune with the vision of the Institution of empowering women, College has devised various Entrepreneurship Development Initiatives so that the students can utilise their talent and skills to make a better living. These students groups from the College level can join together to form their own units and become successful entrepreneurs of tomorrow The Practice College has been imparting various programmes for skill development of students since 2009. Exhibitions cum sale of handworks and vegetables by students has been organised annually. In 2014, Marian Monsoon Fest was started as a fest For Entrepreneurship and Student Welfare. The Fest was held under initiative of IQAC with the support of all stakeholders each year. The students could present their own made products - ornaments, stitched dress, floral decors, Bouquets and home decors. Vegetables grown by students at home was also put for sale. The revenue from the fest were allotted for student welfare. Incubation Centres were started to nurture the skills of students with the support of faculty. PG students of Biotechnology and Microbiology won second place Yuva mastermind programme conducted by 'MalayalaManorama' daily for their product Herbal Mosquito Repellent. Based on the information from newspaper lots of queries and demand was there from the public. Emergency water purification cartridge' another initiative of students won Third place Yuva mastermind programme. Nisarga Incubation centre is an initiative of Bhoomithrasena Club to develop and promote an eco-friendly life style among students. The centre mainly focuses on the making of paper files and paper pens thereby reducing the use of plastic files and pen from the campus. Marian Agri

Nursery, of Dept. of Botany was established in the academic year 2018-19 with an intention to encourage gardening and family farming. With the notion of imparting knowledge of developing aquariums and culture ornamental fishes ,the Department of Zoologyhas initiated an Ornamental Fish Culture Unit, Alankara.Department of Microbiology has initiated an Incubation Centre for Mushroom Cultivation- Sampoorna, and extends the services to public through training and guidance. Shalabha Centre for Butterfly Gardening, an initiative of Department of Zoology and Botany intends popularising conservation of butterflies and setting up of butterfly gardens in institutions. Under the Udhyammithra Centre of Entrepreneurship Development Club and Department of Economics, Bhumika Bags (Cloth bags) were launched.Samridhi Fish Culture Unit under Department of Zoology produces food Fish and supplies to the public.All the activities are run by students mentored by faculty. They become the agents to train the women from the community also Problems Encountered and Resources required Funding is a problem for Arts and Science Colleges. There is time constraint for students to pursue these activities. However faculty and students tries their best to overcome the hurdles and to bring in positive results. Notes Educational institutions can help students develop their skills by merging theory to practice. The students can get a base with the support of faculty and peers. This is to be looked into by the educational institutions. The Title of the Practice-Swastha Sudhdhi: Solid Waste Management Goal Swastha Sudhdhi aims to create awareness among general public on the importance of effective solid waste management through promoting private sector participation and encouraging reuse of nonbiodegradable wastes. The Practice Under Swastha Shudhi, various awareness talks on effective solid waste management was organized Booklets on the usage of bio-bin and vermi- compost pots were distributed among the Kudumbashree members and inmates of Apartments in the City. Exhibitions on various types of solid waste management methods was conducted in collaboration with "Clean City Group- Thrissur" at Punkunnam for creating awareness among the residents. Distribution of Bio-bins and demonstration on its usage to students of various schools and private organizations were conducted. Routine monitoring on the effective use of biobins and vermi compost pots distributed to various places were conducted. Students and staff collected the plastics and other e-wastes from the college campus and houses and handed over it to various agencies for recycling. Training was given to produce decors and other articles of use from discarded plastics. A short film was also created to impart awareness to the public about the necessity of effective solid waste management. Evidence of Success The booklets on vermi composting and use of bio-bins provided step-by-step guidance for the public. The distributed vermi compost pots as well the bio-bins have been effectively utilized by the Kudumbashree members and the residents of nearby apartments. The compost produced was utilized for organic farming. The effective management of solid waste using vermi compost pots and bio-bins were routinely monitored by the concerned teachers. Exploitation of Bio-bins by the schools were also monitored. The school management and the teachers have reported they have advised the student community to deposit their food waste into the bio-bins and waste food management was thus effectively carried out in especially those schools where space is a limiting factor. The plastic and ewastes that are quite difficult to be managed were collected and distributed to agencies that deal with e-waste management. The skill enhancement course on

plastic reuse has enabled the student community to make beautiful products out of worn out plastics thus promoting plastic recycling. Problems Encountered and Resources required Though a major share of people were interested in effective solid waste management, there are some who neglect the aftermath of inefficient management practices. Hence, creating awareness to those people was a challenge. The residents of apartments were bio-bin was distributed were confused as to how the compost can be used as they have no space to carry out organic farming. Notes Though the initiative is a just a beginning, it can bring in remarkable changes especially in an urban locality. An educational institution with a large number of students can play a significant role in preventing unethical waste disposal strategies.
